





Local Transport Options



Buses are the main form of public transport on the Northern Beaches, connecting the local area with train stations, the Manly Ferry Wharf and the CBD via express services.

The Northern Beaches benefits from an extensive network of public bus services in addition to the Northern Beaches On-Demand Service known as 'Keoride' and the B-Line bus services providing frequent connections to the CBD.



The nearest train stations are Roseville, Lindfield, Killara & Gordon stations.

Lindfield Station is approx. 10km from the Northern Beaches and connects the area to:

- Sydney CBD
- · Central Coast
- Newcastle



The Manly Ferry Wharf provides regular CBD services.

The Manly Ferry directly connects Manly to Circular Quay in under 30 minutes with frequent services 7 days per week.

Travelling *Interstate* and *International*

Sydney Kingsford Smith Airport (SYD) is the busiest airport in Australia with direct flights to a multitude of domestic and international destinations.

Sydney Airport can be accessed via car or shuttle transfer taking approx. 45 minutes.



Manly Beach

Patrolled Beach

Surrounded by cosmopolitan cafés and restaurants and a hotspot for Sydney beach culture, the ever-popular Manly Beach is lined with Norfolk Island Pine Trees and features a playground and ocean pool.



Shelly Beach

Part of a protected marine reserve tucked away at the southern end of Manly, Shelly Beach is one of Sydney's most popular snorkelling and scuba diving beaches with shallow, turqouise waters and an abundance of marine life.

North Head Sanctuary, Manly

A natural refuge perched at the northern entrance to Sydney Harbour, the North Head Sanctuary boasts walking and bike tracks through coastal bushland with unspoilt harbour views, native wildlife and historic landmarks.



Ivanhoe Park, Manly

Ivanhoe Park covers 4.5 hectares with established botanic gardens, parkland and a playground to the west and sporting facilities, including Manly Oval, tennis courts and bowling greens, to the east.



Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park

Set across 14,928 hectares of Australian bushland, this national park takes in over 100km of coastline with a plethora of walking tracks, picnic spots and camping grounds to explore the scenic beauty and history of the area.



Stony Range Regional Botanic Garden, Dee Why

An oasis of Australian native plants, Stony Range Regional Botanic Garden is famous for its Spring floral displays and features BBQ and picnic facilities and a walking track.



Cromer Park, Cromer

Recently refurbished and one of the Northern Beaches premier sporting facilities, Cromer Park is host to several soccer fields with state-of-the-art facilities including grandstands, as well as a cricket pitch and parking.



Beverley Job Park, Narraweena

What attracts people to buy in Sydney's Northern Beaches?

The Northern Beaches are a highly-desired coastal expanse with a major drawcard being the beautiful natural amenity.

Living on the Northern Beaches is synonymous with an outdoor lifestyle. With an abundance of world-class beaches – some being protected aquatic and surfing reserves – as well as numerous ocean pools and national parks stretching up to the Central Coast.

Complementing the natural beauty, is the safe, family-friendly community atmosphere found throughout the area.

It is this tranquil beach lifestyle and sense of seclusion which is rare to find within such close proximity to the Sydney CBD, which is only 20 minutes away on the Manly Fast Ferry.

For boating enthusiasts, suburbs surrounding Pittwater are popular with boating facilities and waterfront homes with direct water access and jetties.

What amenities and features are buyers seeking when looking to buy in the area?

Given the coastal locale, water views - whether it be beach, ocean, harbour, bay or lagoon - are highly valued amongst our buyers on the Northern Beaches. Given the lifestyle heavily surrounds the ocean, being nearby to a local beach creates a premium.

Outside of this, having close proximity to schools and walkability to the local village adds to this lifestyle appeal.

What are some buyer trends and expectations currently playing out?

We continue to find strong demand amongst buyers 'rightsizing' from large established houses, to spacious luxury apartments, which maintain generous living spaces. We're seeing many developers respond and cater to this prevailing trend.

Particularly since the onset of the

pandemic, there have been several developments being built along and around beachfront strips where old commercial, houses and apartment buildings are being redeveloped into luxury apartments.

Where are Northern Beaches residential buyers typically coming from?

Northern Beaches buyers are generally local and come from both from within the suburb itself, as well as migrating from nearby suburbs.

Many people in the area are making a shift and <u>rightsizing</u> from large family homes in the Upper North Shore suburbs of St Ives, Turramurra and Gordon as they seek a lifestyle change and better proximity to the beach.

There are also some buyers from the Lower North Shore in suburbs such as Mosman who are buying a second home as a co-primary living play in the northern parts of the Northern Beaches, being from Newport up to Palm Beach.

Major Infrastructure Pipeline

Pipeline Active Transport Corridor Project Beacon Hill to St Ives Underway

- Comprising a 9.2km shared pathway for walkers and cyclists, the \$7.2m Pipeline Active Transport Corridor Project will be delivered in eight stages.
- The project will include new connections and upgrades of existing paths along the Sydney Water pipeline corridor.
- This off-road path will provide a wider, safer connection to communities and destinations.
- The first section to be constructed, Section Six, from Bantry Bay Road to Warringah Road, was completed in early 2023.

Beverley Job Park | Space for Young People Narraweena Reviewing Feedback

- The council is currently reviewing feedback following community feedback and voting amongst young people on potential improvements for Beverley Job Park.
- The currently proposed outdoor space for the north-east corner of the park includes a new multi-use hardcourt, open lawn area, grass embankments and accessible pedestrian pathways.

Manly Dam Link Trail Manly Vale Under Construction

- The link trail, currently under construction, connects Picnic Area 2 and Picnic Area 3 at Manly Dam and will improve safety and accessibility.
- The design will include a raised boardwalk as well as resting points and a viewing deck overlooking the dam reservoir.
